

Our church is our home, a place of warmth, love, friendship, and a safe place to spend time with and receive our Lord. As time has gone on, our level of reverence for the church and the sacred has dissipated. We as Christians are called to encourage each other in showing reverence and respect for Our Father's house, especially in the face of our modern culture of indifference and relativism. Our church and the Divine Liturgy are special. One way in which we acknowledge this fact in an exterior manner is by dressing in our "Sunday best". Taking the time to dress well and appropriately shows that we have made the effort to say, "this Divine Liturgy I am attending is extraordinary and my presence, my inner preparation, and my outerwear all express an acknowledgement of this reverence." If we cannot afford proper attire, that is understandable; but when we choose not to put in a little effort to present ourselves in a manner proper to the celebration and place we are attending, then that is just laziness.

In deliberations with the parish council, we have decided against a swimming pool being installed inside the church, and with that said, please keep the beachwear at home rather than coming dressed in it for church. I am also happy to announce that through your continued support and generosity, St. Maron's has both air conditioning and heat, and is prepared to face the seasons and the weather that we endure throughout the year!


No more does an adult male over the age of 12 years old need to wear shorts to church when it's warm out, as his legs will not get hot because we have air conditioning! No longer does a person have to wear sweatpants or a hooded sweatshirt to church in the winter (or anytime) because we have heat! Gone are the days of ladies wearing short dresses or spaghetti straps because the church was too warm! The idea to make Antioch Hall a gym has been forgotten, so no need to wear gym clothes to church!

The goal of this letter is not to demean or hurt anyone's feelings; rather it is to help us grow and recapture the importance and reverence that we have lost in our parish, which is an issue in practically every church. Just because it's the "new normal" doesn't necessarily mean it's good. We are called to the ideal, not to settle for something less. We are called to this ideal as our Lord says, "Be perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect" MT 5:48. We know perfection is only attained through the grace of God, and at the same time we can do our part both interiorly by working on our spiritual growth and exteriorly by doing our best to give the proper reverence and respect in how we dress when we attend church.

On the back of this letter is a little guide for proper attire and etiquette in church.

10 Rules of Church Etiquette

- + Be punctual. Try to arrive a few minutes before Divine Liturgy and take those few minutes to prepare your mind and soul to participate in the Divine Liturgy.
- + Be reverent. Bow when entering and leaving the Church and crossing in front of the Tabernacle and Altar.
- + Be attentive. Don't use technology. It is not the time for phones or any other distracting devices. All potential noise makers should be kept off or switched to silent.
- + Be considerate. If your child starts to cry, take them out. If you have a young child or know they are prone to make noises, try to find a seat near the aisle for an easy escape.
- + If a child (not a baby) is brought to Divine Liturgy, then the child must behave. Please don't let them run around or spread their toys all over the place.
- + Be quiet. If you need to speak during the Divine Liturgy, do so quietly and discretely. People come to Church to pray and reflect. This requires a peaceful environment. Avoid talking in the Church.
- + Gum chewing, eating, and drinking in Church is not proper etiquette and should be reserved for before or after Divine Liturgy.
- + Visiting and socializing are good ways to share and grow in friendship. Visiting and socializing should be reserved in the space of the foyer and hall and not inside the Church, especially before Divine Liturgy when people are in the church praying and preparing for Divine Liturgy.
- + Participate. The Church has giant screens to display the prayers and hymns for the Divine Liturgy, follow the prayers and respond wholeheartedly, sing along as the choir leads, these are ways in which the Divine Liturgy comes alive as we celebrate.
- + Be hospitable. Greet new people that you see in Church. Go out of your way to make them feel welcome and find ways to help them feel comfortable.
