

WORLD YOUTH DAY – LISBON PORTUGAL

"God is calling you by name," was the opening message by Pope Francis to over 1 million youth gathered for the 16" World Youth Day (WYD) which took place in Lisbon, Portugal August 1st through the 6st. World Youth Day invites Catholic youth the world over to come and share their faith with each other and to collectively worship God. World Youth Day is like an enormous youth retreat that helps to invigorate the faith and life of not only the youth around the world, but adults, young and old alike who attend. The whole week is a time of joy, faith, fun, and really an opportunity of a lifetime to gather with so many of God's people who are all there for the same reason, to share in their worship of God and to unite as the people of God. The atmosphere is palpable, the residents of Lisbon made us feel so welcome, they cheer as pilgrims walk by, the pilgrims themselves all have a spirit of openness and intrigue, wanting to share about their culture and learn about others all under the umbrella of a common faith and belief that animates their interactions. We love Jesus, we are part of the Catholic Church and the joy of Christ is to be shared, and that sentiment and feeling is shared in almost every moment of World Youth Day.

The theme of this World Youth Day was "Mary arose and went with haste..." (Luke 1:39). This passage is in reference to the Blessed Mother, upon hearing that her cousin Elizabeth was pregnant with child, immediately arose to accompany and help her in this time. This theme was shared to the WYD participants in every talk and prayer to remind them that we too are to go with haste when sharing the Gospel. We too are to go with haste when we know one is in need and that we have been called by God to do the same and that we should not be afraid to do that. This theme was developed and shared throughout the week in the different catechesis presentations, the homilies at the Masses, and throughout different events to help the participants understand Mary is a role model of faith for us and in her actions she truly lived the Gospel commands. God invites us to do the same and in doing so we share Jesus with the world and also give the world what it desperately needs, the help and hope of Jesus Christ.

The group of Maronite young adults who went representing the Maronite Church in the US were from Michigan, Illinois, Texas, Massachusetts, Florida, Virginia, California, Iowa, North Carolina, and we also had a young adult join us who lives in Dubai. We were 39 pilgrims in total, many of us meeting for the first time on Sunday, July 30°, and became fast friends. We journeyed together on Monday, July 31st to Fatima, to visit Our Lady of Fatima and to see the place of the apparition of our Blessed Mother to the three shepherd children, Lucy, Jacinta, and Francisco. The shrine and church are magnificent and one can feel the sanctity and Spirit of God in this holy place. We were able to visit the church and pray together, light candles, and share with the many thousands of pilgrims from around the world who were visiting there as well. It was definitely a highlight of our pilgrimage. On Tuesday, August 1st, the only official event was the opening Mass in the evening at 7 pm and as we all had a "free day" many of us went sightseeing, took advantage of the many events throughout the city that were

sponsored by WYD like religious concerts, different spiritual talks by world renowned speakers, visited the different booths and festival events around the city with the WYD theme. No matter where we went there were pilgrims from all over the world that were friendly and inviting and we struck up conversations with many people as we walked to the different events. The sharing and learning about others continued throughout the week and was such a beautiful aspect to enhance our experience. In the evening, the opening Mass took place outdoors and we celebrated with almost 1 million of our new closest friends! It is amazing to be celebrating Mass with so many people and the clamor of the crowd is always part of the experience, but there is nothing like experiencing the silence that comes over the crowd when the words of consecration are prayed and then praying the Lord's Prayer all together — it was powerful!

On Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, there were a series of catechesis events called the "Rise Up Encounter." These are catechesis events hosted in the morning in different places and parks throughout the city in different languages, inviting the youth to attend and to deepen and grow in their faith. For example, many of our group went to one of the English catechesis programs where we sang, prayed, heard testimonies and presentations, and concluded with Mass. That program would begin at 9:30 am and end with Mass concluding at 12:30 pm. We were with pilgrims from Australia, USA, South Africa, England, and other English-speaking countries or pilgrims who wanted to hear the catechesis in English. Some of our group attended the Arabic speaking catechesis events, which had the same format but were presented in the Arabic language. There were Catholics from Lebanon, Syria, Iraq, UAE, Egypt, Palestine, and other Arabic speaking countries. One of the highlights for all of us were meeting Maronites and other Eastern Catholics from all over the world. Australia brought many Maronites and so did Lebanon, and we met Chaldeans from Iraq, Sweden, and the USA. Also, a fun note to share is that everywhere we went, any opportunity we had, we danced dabke!

The Pope's first event with the pilgrims was a prayer service and welcome message on Thursday night where we prayed and heard the Pope's message of encouraging our youth to know that God has called us by name and we are the community of the called, and that God knows us intimately and loves us. On Friday evening we prayed the Way of the Cross with Pope Francis and to be a part of that prayer with so many people who were there praying and recalling the stations of the Cross and what our Lord has done for us was so powerful. Standing shoulder to shoulder with people from different cultures, languages, and walks of life, yet all of us in solidarity praying the Way of the Cross adoring our Lord was an unforgettable experience.

On Saturday we prepared our bags and, in the afternoon, began the pilgrim walk from our hotel to the park where we would camp out all night and wake up in the morning to celebrate the final Mass together. The walk took close to 3.5 hours and we walked from one side of Lisbon to the other, encountering many pilgrims and people along the way. Residents waved and cheered, honking their horns and encouraging us as we walked and as we drew closer to the park, and we joined many other pilgrims who were on their journey as well. We arrived and celebrated the Evening vigil prayer service with the Pope and after that took the opportunity to go and talk with the other pilgrims who were there. Some people relaxed after a long walk and other youth would gather in a giant group and sing different hymns and songs and dance (this happened until 1 am in some places!). The conclusion was the Sunday morning Mass that had an attendance of over 1.5 million people throughout the park; it was amazing and almost unbelievable. Being with so many people and praying and receiving the Eucharist together, the presence of the Holy Spirit was invigorating. The whole experience reignites one's faith to see the Church alive and vibrant with the youth and adults present. There really is no other event that is more inspiring and brings such joy.

A WYD tradition is to take items from your home country to trade with pilgrims you meet during the pilgrimage and that we did. A bracelet, a keychain, stickers, coins, and other trinkets are exchanged after a conversation of sharing and learning. We all came home with not only new items from friends we met along the way but with memories that will last a lifetime. We brought back with us a new appreciation for our faith, meeting people from all over the world, especially inspired by those who came from countries in which they are persecuted for their faith, and knowing that our Church is alive and well and there is a generation coming after us who will carry the Gospel and helps its light shine throughout the World.
